

## B&H: Don't Abandon Working Families in New York City

In 2015 the workers at two B&H warehouses in Bushwick and in the Brooklyn Navy Yard had enough with facing discrimination on the job, working in unsafe conditions and spending long hours at work. They decided to do something about it. They decided to form a union.

B&H struck back with an aggressive anti-union campaign, threatening and intimidating workers involved in the unionization effort. The workers stood strong and with the support of thousands of New Yorkers, after a months-long effort they voted overwhelmingly to join the Steelworkers Union.

## But now hundreds of B&H workers may lose their jobs.

B&H management has announced plans to close its two Brooklyn warehouses and move the work 75 miles away to New Jersey. Nearly all of the B&H workers live in New York and rely on public transportation so this move will make impossible for most to continue working for the company. B&H says that they're moving because they can't renew their lease or find another location in New York but that seems unlikely. B&H's owners own dozens of other properties throughout New York City.

We believe that B&H is relocating to New Jersey—a move that would displace as many as 375 workers—to get away from the union. When workers stand up for good, safe jobs, we can't let companies like B&H cut and run.
